the waste bags up on trash days.

Police Report Police Chief Cole Dinkel gave the police department report. Cole stated there were com-

plaints regarding the last tornado siren and how homeowners were unable to hear them. He stated we should go back to the old way. Chief Dinkel also submitted a bid from Tri-Central Office supply for new desks for the Police Department. The bid was \$2,600.00. New desks will be considered after discussion about flooring in the Health Facility.

City Superintendent Report City Superintendent Brad Schmidtberger gave his department report. He stated he received an installation fee regarding the Lift Station of \$22,000.00 that was not included bid last month. Council advised him to contact HFE and get a bid for installations as well. Brad is also getting bids on the roof of Wellhouse #8 after it blew off in the last storm. He also stat-

ed to swap out the trash truck bed, would run around \$15,000—\$20,000.
