Coalition receives grant



Jeff Pfeifer, president of the Victoria Community Coalition, announced recently that the organization has received a \$5,000 grant from the Heartland Community Foundation through the Dane G. Hansen Fund. This is the first grant the group has received. The Coalition was created earlier this year with the goal of repurposing the former St. John Nursing Home in Victoria.

The funds will be used to secure architectural advice needed to determine the plausibility of redeveloping the property into senior housing, day care, and use by the Ellis County Historical Society. The project is intended to bring people together to support the growth of Victoria.

In acknowledgment, Pfeifer stated: The Heartland grant is exactly the boost we needed to help keep our efforts going. Heartland has been involved in Victoria since January. I don't think they would be so supportive if it weren't for the community's enthusiasm and consistent involvement."

Free smoke alarms offered to residents

Fire Chief John Weber wants to make the public aware of a special fire alarm program being sponsored in conjunction with the Kansas State Fire Marshal. The program will provide homeowners with free smoke alarms which will be installed by members of the Victoria Fire Department. The program especially hopes to target residences that consist of children and the elderly since these categories are most affected by fire-related deaths.

Anyone interested in securing alarms for their home should call City Hall at 785 735-2259 and ask to be placed on the list. Once the number of requests totals 12, the department can then place an order to receive them. Upon delivery, the homeowners will be contacted to schedule a time for installation. There is an installation form that must be completed by the installer and then submitted to the fire marshal's office. Rental properties are not eligible for this program.

While on site, the installers will also provide instruction on how the alarms work, how to test and maintain them, what to do if the alarm sounds and how to create a home fire escape plan and practice it.
