Owner seeking new purposes for former rest home

Jeff Pfeifer, Victoria native and new owner of the former St. John's Rest Home, is a man with a mission. When he purchased the 40,000 sq. ft. facility which has been vacant since 2012, he clearly had two goals: to preserve the building and to make it an asset for the community.

With those goals in mind, he has been hard at work researching, networking with community members and investigating potential sources of funding.

In mid-September, Pfeifer hosted a tour of the building and a brainstorming session for anyone interested. Approximately 90 people attended. Many ideas were suggested for the use of the space including use by the Victoria Recreation Commission as an exercise facility and a gathering place for groups for activities and social events, the Ellis County Historical Society, community daycare and senior apartments being the most popular. While many would like to see it used as a care facility once again, Pfeifer says the attorneys he has consulted say that according to terms of the original sale, the building could never be used for that purpose in perpetuity.

Pfeifer has set up a Facebook page, savetheresthome where he encourages people to "follow, like, share, message and comment.' He is also available for communication through his email 006pfeifer@gmail.com.

Presently he says that finding the funding for any development can go two directions: either through grants and private donations as a 501c(3) or through other entities that would have a for-profit trajectory.

In his view, Pfeifer sees daycare as the top need and the area where he is investing most of his energy. He encourages anyone interested in opening a daycare to contact him. Meanwhile, Pfeifer asserts, "I'm working as fast as I can and leaving no stone unturned!"
