Two properties need to be sent letters about cleaning them up. One is 11th and Birch and the other is Cedar and 11th. Council was in agreement to send letters to the property owners.

City Hall

Mayor Schulte spoke with Bryan Brady and First Care is not willing to increase the hours the clinic is open. The square footage of the clinic would have twice the space as the current city hall. Steve Brummer presented a to-scale drawing of the plans for a new building that Colin Schmidtberger had drawn up.
