The May City bills reflect the new sewer averages based on customers' usage from Dec. 20—Mar. 20. This average is kept for one year.



The City's watering policies for the upcoming months will remain the same as last year. Watering of shrubs and flowers and washing of cars is allowed any day during the appropriate hours. Residents may also water their lawns one day per week. Those living south of 10th St. may water on Tuesdays; those living north of 10th may water on Thursdays. ALL WATERING IS TO BE DONE BEFORE 10:00 am OR AFTER 7:00 pm.



A reminder that as the weather warms up and household projects are planned, the City requires building permits for items such as roofing, porch and deck construction, etc. The City also requires that contractors be licensed with the City. A list of all those licensed can be obtained at City Hall.



City pool manager Karen Nowak has tentative plans for the starting of pool season, depending upon the status of state regulations for the corona virus. If life resumes some normalcy, the opening day for pool patrons will be May 25. Two sets of swimming lessons will be from June 15-19 and June 22-26.
