Our city workers are asking for the public's assistance in their usage of the recycling facility. **Please do NOT throw** any form of Styrofoam or any kind of poly plastic such as chip bags or trash bags in the bins. The bins are clearly labeled to indicate what materials can be disposed of in each bin. Your help is appreciated!



Citizens also need to know that the burn pile is restricted to tree limbs no bigger than 6 inches in diameter. No other lumber or furniture items are allowed!



Pet owners are reminded that it's time to register their furry friends at City Hall BEFORE March 1. Both dogs and cats require tags. Cost of tags for spayed/neutered animals is only \$2.00 if purchased before that deadline. A current rabies immunization must be presented at the time a tag is issued. After that deadline, a late fee of \$1.00 per month is charged. Owners whose pets are not licensed also run the risk of a \$50 fine if their pet is picked up without a tag.

Automatic withdrawal payment option: forms for this are also available at the City office.

Monthly statements via email—see page three for details.

UPS pickup—you can drop off your pre-labeled items or we can process packages for you.

In connection with the citywide garage sale, the City will again provide dumpsters at the recycling site the weekend of April 30 for disposal of large items. Hours will be posted on the city website. Residents are reminded that if disposing of refrigerators or air conditioners, Freon must be drained from them. Also, no household hazardous waste or tires will be accepted.

City Receives Funds

The City of Victoria has received a \$1,000 donation from the Midwest Energy Community Fund spring disbursement. These funds will be used to replenish the mulch on the city playground in Honey Braun Park. Over 110 organizations submitted applications for the awards.

The Midwest Energy Community Fund was created in 2005, and provides funds to activities that focus on youth, arts, education, libraries, community events, and similar projects. Five committees of Midwest Energy customers determine who receives the awards ranging from \$50 to \$1,000.

The Midwest Community Fund awards grants twice a year; application deadlines are March 1 and October 1. Applications are being accepted now for disbursements in the spring of 2016. January is school board member appreciation month. This is a critical time to have board members who stand up for public education. Keeping a vital and successful school is of great significance for our entire community! Our school board members work hard to create a future for every child in our district. I would like to extend a huge "Thank You" to each of our board members: Kevin Huser, Darrell Dortland, Karen Nowak, PJ Nowak, Don Pruitt, Shannon Radke, and Alan Schulte. I would also encourage you to do likewise if you have the occasion.

With revenue streams continuing to shrink in the state and school district, each community member in our school district feels a greater burden with property taxes. Due to shrinking district assessments, our district lost \$173,435 in funding. The state of Kansas offered an opportunity to apply for "extraordinary funding" through the State Finance Council. District need was based on increased enrollment, loss of assessed valuation and other unforeseen circumstances that impact budgets. USD #432 applied for this funding on the basis of loss of assessed valuation. I am very pleased to announce that our district received \$133,901 from this fund. The money cannot be spent this budget year. It will be applied directly to our LOB, local option budget, for the 2016-2017 school year. This equates to a savings of over four and a half mills of tax relief for the taxpayers in our district.

Mr. Luke Johnson has the band and chorus sounding wonderful. He showcased the talents of his students at our district Christmas program. The music was enjoyed and appreciated by everyone in attendance!

We are excited about the education that we offer at USD #432! Our students are eager to learn, and our staff is second to none! 2016 brings great promise and an opportunity to implement change and growth within our schools. Again, I want to recognize the value of a community that is so proud of its past, yet so excited about its future. Our students are our best advertisement and our future. Please help USD #432 to build on our success of the past to ensure a bright future for all of our students.

I would like to extend a wish that everybody had a happy, safe holiday season. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their support during this and every football season.
